INSTRUCTIONS FOR LEARNERS COMPLETING IVAs

1. The Integrated Vocational Assignment (IVA) is a compulsory part of your qualification. If you do not complete the IVA you may not receive your certificate.
2. Your tutor(s) will tell you how long you have to complete the IVA and the access you may have to resources.
3. Read the IVA carefully and make sure that you understand the work you should hand in and what is required of you. If you are uncertain, discuss it with your tutor(s).
4. The IVA requires you to work by yourself and to produce original work. You should not share your work with any other learners. For example, if you produce an illustration or diagram electronically, you should not give it to another learner. Similarly, you should not accept and use such information from others. You are required to sign that the work submitted is your own.
5. If you work in a group at any stage, you must present your own responses to each task for assessment.
6. Information taken from sources for research, e.g. internet and textbooks, must be identified and not presented as your own work. You should list the sources used.
7. Some tasks may require Observation Records/Witness Statements. Your tutor(s) will organise for these to be completed and you must attach these to your submitted work.
8. In presenting your final work, you should not include draft work or reference materials such as handouts, notes and leaflets, unless the tasks specifically ask you to do so.
9. Presentation of your work:
 - Check that you have completed all tasks.
 - Label work with the appropriate task/sub task number.
 - Present tasks in the correct order.
 - Label each page with your name and page number.
 - Submit all electronic materials in paper format
 - Clearly label video or audio tapes submitted as part of your assignment.
 - All papers should be securely bound.
 - The completed IVA should NOT be presented in plastic envelopes, a box file or a lever arch file.

YOUR ASSIGNMENT TASKS

This assignment requires you to demonstrate the skills required to perform manual, mechanical and electrical facial treatments. In order to complete this assignment you must be able to develop appropriate treatment plans and apply facial treatments to a professional standard. You must be able to provide appropriate home care advice and identify commercial opportunities associated with all treatments.

TASK 1

You must demonstrate facial treatments in a realistic working environment. All the tasks will be based on real clients who have received treatment as part of your practical assessment activities.

You should consult with your tutor over the choice of suitable clients, in order that you may provide the range of facial treatments.

You must devise treatment plans for different clients. Each treatment plan must consider the facial treatments for *Unit 8: Facial Therapy*. You must maintain a report that describes your activity for each of the tasks.

1.a.

Describe the procedures that you need to carry out before applying facial therapy treatments noting any health and safety requirements. You need to consider the procedures for these facial therapy treatments:

- manual
- massage
- mechanical
- electrical,

You should describe procedures around:

- client consultation
- keeping record cards
- treatment methods
- provision of consumables and non-consumables.

1.b.

For these facial therapy treatments:

- manual
- massage
- mechanical
- electrical,

describe these pre-treatment procedures, noting any health and safety requirements:

- skin analysis
- preparation of the skin
- indications and contraindications
- sterilisation and sanitisation.

1.c.

For the range of facial treatments you should explain why the pre-treatment preparation procedures are necessary. You must also describe the possible consequences of not following the correct pre-treatment preparation procedures.

This task provides evidence for unit 8 criteria P2, M2, D2.

TASK 2

2.a.

Identify the procedures that you use to apply the full range of facial therapy treatments noting any health and safety requirements. You need to note how long and how frequently the treatments should be applied. You need to consider these procedures:

Massage techniques:

- effleurage
- petrissage
- tapotment,

Mechanical techniques:

- safe application of vapour
- exfoliation
- lymphatic drainage,

Electrical techniques:

- safe application of direct and indirect high frequency
- galvanic desincrustation and iontophoresis
- EMS and microcurrent.

2.b.

Describe how the procedures used for applying facial therapy treatments are carried out. You need to consider the procedures for adapting massage to skin type and condition. You need to consider the techniques listed above.

2.c.

Explain why you would choose any given treatment rather than a different one for each of the three sets of techniques. You need to consider the techniques listed above.

This task provides evidence for unit 8 criteria P3, M3, D3.

TASK 3

3.a.

Describe the benefits to the client of each of the following facial treatments:

- Massage
- Mechanical
- Electrical.

3.b.

Describe the benefits to the client of each of the following individual facial treatment techniques:

Massage techniques:

- effleurage
- petrissage
- tapotment,

Mechanical techniques:

- safe application of vapour
- exfoliation
- lymphatic drainage,

Electrical techniques:

- safe application of direct and indirect high frequency
- galvanic desincrustation and iontophoresis
- EMS and microcurrent.

3.c.

Describe the benefits of combining different massage techniques. Justify the combinations of different techniques for a range of at least three different circumstances. Evaluate the outcomes for clients of these combinations of different techniques. You should consider in each case whether:

- desired outcomes were achieved
- time expended was appropriate
- costs to client were reasonable.

This task provides evidence for unit 8 criteria P4, M4, D4.

TASK 4

4.a.

For facial therapy techniques, list the contraindications/indications. You should list the range of:

- dermatological conditions
- allergies
- medical conditions
- issues for sensitive tissue.

4.b.

For facial therapy techniques, describe the contraindications/indications. You should describe the range of conditions shown above.

4.c.

For facial therapy techniques, explain the causes and consequences of contraindications/indications. You should explain the range of conditions shown above.

This task provides evidence for unit 8 criteria P5, M5, D5.

TASK 5

A range of different products is available to beauty therapists for use in facial treatments. Examples of products from this range are:

- cleansers
- face wash
- face scrubs
- exfoliants
- toners
- moisturisers
- face masks
- massage creams
- oils
- oxygenating preparations
- specialised gels
- ampoules.

5.a.

Describe the purpose of the range products used in facial treatments. You should consider the products listed above.

5.b.

Explain how the products in the range work. You need to consider the products listed above.

5.c.

Evaluate the range of products used in facial treatments. You should consider:

- the effectiveness of the products used in facial treatment
- whether or not the products work as well as the suppliers claim
- whether some products work better than other products and why this is the case.

This task provides evidence for unit 8 criteria P6, M6, D6.

TASK 6

As part of your client after care, you should provide home care advice. You should also explore any retail opportunities.

6.a.

Identify the home care advice that you should give clients following facial treatments, note this on the client treatment record cards. Identify any opportunities to sell your clients cosmetic and facial treatment products.

6.b.

Explain the home care advice that you have provided your clients. Explain why you would recommend particular cosmetic and facial treatment products.

6.c.

Justify why you have offered the particular home care advice to clients, rather than other home care advice. Justify why you have selected particular cosmetic and facial treatment products rather than other, similar products.

This task provides evidence for unit 8 criteria P7, M7, D7.

TASK 7

Complete all the practical work in *Unit 8: Body Therapy* and complete the record provided. You must be able to demonstrate that you can carry **out all the treatments listed in each category**, to a safe, professional and commercial standard.

You must maintain record cards, select and prepare materials, tools and equipment competently and with due regard to health and safety.

Unit 8: Facial Therapy

Manual facial treatments

1. cleansing
2. exfoliation
3. extraction
4. face masks
5. toning
6. moisturisation

Manual facial massage treatments

1. effleurage
2. petrissage
3. tapotement

Mechanical facial treatments

1. vapour treatment
2. exfoliation (brush cleansing)
3. lymphatic drainage

Electrical facial treatments

1. direct, high frequency
2. indirect, high frequency
3. galvanic desincrustation
4. iontophoresis
5. electrical muscle stimulation (EMS)
6. microcurrent

All the treatments must be carried out with due regard to health and safety and to indications and contraindications.

Each treatment must be signed off and dated by your assessor when you can consistently achieve the standard required.

This task provides evidence for unit 8 criterion P8.

TASK 8

For each client you must maintain appropriately completed record cards. The record card should:

15.a

indicate the materials, tools and equipment selected. The record cards should indicate the type, frequency and duration of the facial therapy treatments.

15.b

indicate why the particular treatment was selected.

15.c

justify why the particular treatment was selected in preference to others.

This task provides evidence for unit 8 criteria P1, M1, D1.
